MTSS Updates



Module 3 – SLD Evaluation and Identification

MTSS training Cohorts 1&2 will begin *Module 3* in early September. The course will run through December 2017 and is intended to guide participants through best practices for evaluating and identifying specific learning disabilities (SLD), as per the 2020 NC SLD Policy Addendum. While the primary focus is on students with SLD, course content has utility when evaluating and identifying students in other disability categories. Information and concepts from MTSS Modules 1 and 2 will be applied when making high stakes decisions regarding eligibility for special education services.

As Module 3 content is released this school year, additional targeted training opportunities for school psychologists and other specialized staff will be offered in order to prepare for full implementation of the SLD policy changes within an MTSS framework.
